

This exhibition will run until early August.

The performing arts segment started with a collaboration between Dance and Vocals with a bright and colourful rendition of Peter Allen's 'I Go To Rio'. Register Now For The Year 10 Secondary School Immunisations Program

Immunisation saves lives and is a proven and safe way to protect against diseases.

The protection provided by some childhood immunisations fades over time and needs to be boosted in adolescence.

Secondary school students are at an age when a vaccine will be most effective and provide protection before possible exposure to a disease.

Making sure your child receives their secondary school immunisations will help to keep them healthy and well through secondary school and into adulthood. Immunisations are safe and effective, and administered by a council nurse at secondary schools.

Students in Year 10 (or aged 15-16) receive the Meningococcal ACWY vaccine (1 dose). To help make the program a success, we need you as parents/carers to register and consent on our online booking platform VaxApp.



Come and join the girls at their 2nd training session this Sunday, 9.45am at the Catherine McAuley College, Trotting Terrace -Junortoun.




